ACC 1: Approval of the July 22, 2009 Access to Care Committee Meeting Minutes

M/S/C (Bettinger/Le) to approve the July 22, 2009 Access to Care Committee meeting minutes as

presented. The motion passed unanimously.

ACC 2: Update regarding Loan Repayment Program Legislature

Interim Executive Officer DeCuir reported that there was a loan repayment program which would pay up to \$104,000 toward student loan repayment to dentists who contracted to practice for at least three years in a dentally underserved area, as defined by the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development. He noted that there are still funds available in the account, approximately \$1.7 million, and SB 599 would give the Board the authority to expend those funds. He reported that as an urgency bill, this bill would be effective January 1, 2010.

ACC 3: Discussion Regarding the Need for Access to Care in Rural Communities across California

Ms. Downing noted that this item was placed on the agenda at the request of Dr. Geis, who was concerned with the quality of care in Denti-Cal clinics. Mr. DeCuir stated that Dr. Geis was

concerned with the production aspect of care in these clinics, however this issue is complaint-driven. Dr. Le agreed that a complaint must be received before an investigation can begin.
