Dr. Olinger, Chair, called the meeting to order at 3:34 p.m. Roll was called and a quorum was established.

CE 1: Approval of the July 22, 2009 Continuting Education Committee Meeting Minutes

M/S/C (Le/Forsythe) to approve the Continuing Education Committee meeting minutes as presented. The motion passed unanimously.

<u>CE 2:</u> Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Possible Recommendations to the Board to Initiate a Rulemaking to Expand the Current Content of the Mandatory California Dental Practice Act Course to Include Instruction in Substance Abuse

Donna Kantner, the Dental Board's Legislation and Regulations Analyst, noted that this item was placed on the agenda at the request of LaDonna Drury-Klein, President of the California Association of Dental Assisting Teachers. She informed the Board that this would require a rulemaking to amend Section 1016. Dr. Olinger asked if one hour could be specified. Legal Counsel LaVonne Powell noted that the Board currently requires the maximum of 7 mandatory hours. Ms. Kantner explained that the intent is to include this instruction within the currently required mandatory Dental Practice Act course, not to add an additional course. Ms. Klein noted that this language was originally developed for the previous rulemaking and asked that that language be brought back to the Board for approval. M/S/P (Bettinger/Forsythe) that the Committee recommend to the Board that staff initiate a rulemaking to amend Title 16 of the California Code of Regulations to include education regarding substance abuse within the content of the mandatory California Dental Practice Act course and direct staff to develop regulatory language for adoption at a future meeting.
